

The Spring concerts of the LCMS 2015/16 Season offer a further rich variety of artists and ensembles. After the Aquinas Trio perform piano trios by Mendelssohn, Brahms and the premiere of a new work by Thomas Hyde on 13 March, we welcome a larger ensemble with the excellent young musicians of the Park Lane Group, and beautiful string quintets and sextets by Mozart, Strauss and Tchaikovsky.

3 April features another of the LCMS contributions to the Kings Place 'Baroque Unwrapped' series, with Martin Feinstein directing a selection of baroque orchestral masterworks by Bach, Handel and Telemann. The following week presents the first of two duos this Spring – the wonderful Duo Leonore, comprising the cellist Maja Weber (with her remarkable Stradivarius 'Suggia' cello), and the pianist Per Lundberg, performing a beautiful selection of cello and piano works, including sonatas by Beethoven and Rachmaninov. On 17 April, the celebrated piano duo of John and Fiona York play music by Ravel, Schubert's haunting 'Fantasie', and Holst's mighty 'Planets' Suite, in celebration of the work's centenary.

Our last concert in April brings the third of our historical Mozart, Bartók and Beethoven quartet cycle with the Chilingirian Quartet – three more to come in 2016/17!

1 May features the LCMS debut of 'I Musicanti' in quintets by Dvořák, Smirnov, and together with the pianist Martin Roscoe, a performance of the chamber arrangement of Beethoven's sublime fourth Piano Concerto.

The final concert of the season on 8 May features the London Firebird Orchestra in a wonderful selection of popular classics for chamber orchestra - the overture and two arias from Mozart's 'Marriage of Figaro', Benjamin Baker in Mendelssohn's beautiful Violin Concerto, and Haydn's famous 'Drumroll' symphony.

Bach's Leipzig period is associated with his enormous output of cantatas and masses. But he was also the organiser of a famous series of coffee concerts at Zimmermann's Coffeehouse on Catherstrasse. Records show that orchestral works by Handel and Telemann featured at Zimmermann's, as did Bach's own orchestral suites. Here Telemann's virtuoso showpiece, Handel's elegant *Water Music* and Bach's own famous Orchestral Suite in B minor create a fascinating juxtaposition.

The German Swiss-based duo opens a perfect Sunday evening programme with one of the most lyrical of Beethoven's five cello sonatas, complemented by the passionate and melodic writing of the Cello Sonata by British composer Peter Fribbins. Gabriel Fauré's famous *Elégie* makes a fitting prelude to one of the most famous romantic works for cello and piano – Rachmaninoff's mighty Cello Sonata from 1901.

York2, 'the piano duo with a difference', perform Ravel's joyful *Rapsodie espagnole*, and Schubert's hauntingly beautiful Fantasie – one of his most famous chamber works. We also hear – in the work's centenary year – Holst's own piano arrangement of his legendary *Planets* suite, whose manuscript was discovered by John York only a few years ago.

The third concert in our historic

series commemorating the 70th anniversary of Bartók's death by reconstructing the first complete cycle of his quartets in the UK in 1949/50. Each of the six is framed by one of Beethoven's six Op. 18 quartets, and by one of Mozart's mature quartets, to complement the energy and tautness of Bartók and Beethoven's musical style. The Blech Quartet originally gave this concert in January 1950.

I MUSICANTI WITH MARTIN ROSCOE

Dvořák String Quintet in G, Op.77 Smirnov Piano Quintet, Op.72 Beethoven (arr. Lachner) Piano Concerto No.4 in G, Op.58

Making its debut in the LCMS series, I Musicanti numbers among its ranks some of the UK's most respected musicians, directed by double bass virtuoso Leon Bosch. They open with Dvořák's highly melodic bass guintet, and are joined by the famous British pianist Martin Roscoe in the Piano Ouintet by Russianborn composer Dmitri Smirnov. Their programme culminates with Franz Lachner's contemporary arrangement of Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 4 – its chamber version bringing out the intimate qualities of this most personally expressive of Beethoven concertos.

London Firebird Orchestra returns to Kings Place with a wonderful selection of Classical and early Romantic music. Jonathan Bloxham conducts the overture and two arias from Mozart's *Marriage of Figaro* and New Zealander Benjamin Baker performs Mendelssohn's perennially popular Violin Concerto. The concert ends with a bang – Haydn's famous *Drumroll* symphony, given its premiere in London in 1795.


